
Recognition of 'Bangla language' as an Indian classical language!

Government of India recognized 'Bangla language' as 'Indian Classical Language' on 3rd October 2024 by Central Cabinet decision. Besides Bengali, the Government of India also designated Marathi, Pali, Prakrit and Assamese as 'Indian Classical Languages'.

Union Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnab made this announcement in front of reporters in New Delhi on October 3, 2024. The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi took this historic decision on 3rd October 2024.

These classical languages are the custodians of India's heritage, reflecting the historical and cultural milestones of their respective communities.

Earlier on October 12, 2004, Tamil Language was first recognized as an Indian Classical Language by the Government of India. Then Sanskrit was recognized as an Indian classical language in 2005, Telugu and Kannada in 2008, Malayalam in 2013 and Oriya in 2014.
